# IMPSON

#### INTERVIEW BY DEMI JHAGRA



Rob has been working for Holland Studio Craft for eight years, first as a graphic designer and then progressing to design manager. Many of his designs and drawings illustrate the Enchantica books. Now as senior designer he not only designs for the Enchantica range but uses his talented sculpting skills to create the models as well.

Other collections he has modelled include Mr Men and Little Miss and more recently, a set of figures based on the children's television programme, Trumpton.

His first sculpture for Enchantica was the Guardian of the Orb, which he started in early 2000.

Rob developed the idea of a dragon and an orb about three years ago but the first real drawing came together with the Extravaganza 2000 T-shirt featuring both elements. He drafted the story around two years ago. The resulting model is a wonderful 3D sculpture that is something of a first as it is a new concept for the fantasy area. The idea is very much a result of Rob's own vivid imagination.

Rob, like many other sculptors, is inspired by a variety of sources. Fantasy fiction and science fiction films like Star Wars, Indiana Jones, Sinbad, The Crow and Bladerunner all have an influence, as does his own very vivid and rich imagination. He likes watching films to escape from reality into a fantasy world, amongst his favourite artists are Michael Kaluta, Brom, Boris and Keith Parkinson.

His favourite Enchantica pieces to date are Vrorst and Glimmerscale, because he enjoyed creating all their intricate details. He likes Vrorst because of his character - everyone loves to hate a baddie! Turn to page 12 and 13 to see waxes of Glimmerscale and Vrorst which are due to be launched in July 2001.

Outside of work Rob has many interests and hobbies. You may be interested to learn that his favourite colour is green because it reminds him of his youth when he was fascinated by Spitfires, Hurricanes and aviation in general. He also likes motor sports and Green is the British racing colour. He has no preference to any particular shade, just green because it is natural peaceful colour.

Motorbikes are just one of his many interests and he is especially interested in the mechanics and workings of their engines. He enjoys going to cinemas and theatres with his fiance, Sharon, although this means he has to leave his four cats behind. Any other free time is spent on his computer playing games – currently his favourite is "Thief", a medieval inspired adventure. No doubt he will get another game on his birthday on July 7th, when he will be 35 years old.

He has attended all the Extravaganza events and really enjoys participating in them. As in previous years Rob is looking forward to Extravaganza 2001 and meeting collectors, both familiar faces and new ones, again. He finds that feedback from collectors about his pieces and Enchantica in general is vital because

people's reactions and views inspire a great deal of his work and gives him the motivation of producing ever more fantastic and creative pieces.

Finally, Rob would like to say to all collectors everywhere, 'A big thank you for collecting Enchantica. Please continue to write in with your comments about the pieces as it is only by hearing from you that we can develop our ranges. I love seeing your wonderful pictures of your own fantasy ideas and sharing in the excitement and thrill of collecting Enchantica.'

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Fiona Hawthorne joined Royal Doulton in early 2000 as marketing director of themed collectables which includes responsibility for Enchantica and Holland Studio Craft products. Prior to Royal Doulton, Fiona worked for Wedgwood for eight years. Fiona is Australian and although she makes annual trips back to see her family she misses immediate contact with them. She brings immense passion, honesty and a fresh and direct approach to the development of Company products.

A major part of Fiona's first nine months with the Company was taken up with a review of the ranges and defining the strategy for the future. Enchantica has been part of this process and Fiona has very much enjoyed learning about the world of Enchantica, reading the novels and understanding from collectors and retailers what ideas were popular and where there were areas for concern.

Collectors via the discussion forums, through our full postbag (electronic and by post) and by telephone have raised all kinds of questions about Enchantica and Fiona is now able, through the pages of the newsletter, to answer some of these concerns.

#### What is the future of Enchantica?

I am passionate about the future of Enchantica and I want to develop dragons, wizards and other fantasy characters inspired by the books which will continue to inspire, delight and enthral our collectors. Development plans are in place to ensure two launches a year. These will include a variety of product including limited editions, general range and a selection of price points for each launch. There is massive potential for new subjects from the Enchantica novels including old favourites in new poses as well as characters who have never been modelled before.

#### What are the new products?

July 2001 launches include Glimmerscale, Hexerne, Juvula, Grawlfang and Vrorst and the approved wax models of these pieces can be seen on pages 12 and 13. We hope that decorated examples will be on show at the Extravaganza, when I will be talking in more detail about these new pieces and highlighting some of our plans for January 2002.

#### Are there any other developments?

We are developing a new range of packaging and certificates which will be more in keeping with the Enchantica range. We hope to launch these in January 2002, if not before.

## In recent year events have been notified very late in the year, can you tell us if there are any events planned for this year?

The Extravaganza is planned for May 27th and full details are on pages 8 and 9. We have also confirmed five UK events with retailers and the details are given on page.

#### What is the country of origin for Enchantica pieces?

From the launches for mid year 2001 Enchantica collectables will be manufactured either in Thailand or China. The country of origin will be clearly marked on each piece. We have had to move to overseas manufacture for various reasons and to ensure that we continue to offer collectors the highest quality of design at the best value. Most of our competitors already source from overseas.

Enchantica collectables will continue to be designed in the UK by our talented team of artists and the current Enchantica collection will continue to be manufactured in the UK.

#### What will you do to ensure consistent quality?

We will insist that rigorous quality controls and inspections are enforced by our partner manufacturers.

#### What will happen to the current production team?

Unfortunately we have had to inform the current team that their positions will be phased out during 2001. All employees affected by this change will be offered alternative roles by the company and we hope that they will continue to work for Royal Doulton.


#### Design a Dragon

#### Joe Bailey

# Exhibiting Enchantica

Have you ever wondered how retailers select their stock for their shops? How do they make the decision on which products to stock?

Throughout the year gift manufacturers attend trade shows and exhibitions to which retailers are invited. From these shows, many of which are massive, (for example the major industry Spring Fair held at the National Exhibition Centre (N.E.C.) fills 12 of the vast exhibition halls) a retailer decides which products to stock.

With such competition manufacturers have to ensure that their own displays are eye-catching and this is an area where Royal Doulton expertise is applied with outstanding success. At the two UK shows attended by the Company so far this year some fantastic displays were created showing ingenuity and empathy with Enchantica product. One of the shows took place within our own headquarters

showrooms at Minton House and the second was at the N.E.C. Planning for the shows begins with a meeting of the Visual Merchandising team led by Pat

Merchandising team led by Pat Booth with product managers to discuss all the new products that are to be launched and the layout of the showroom and the stand at the N.E.C.

The in-house team work very much together on planning the overall layout and budgets for the projects and once these have all been approved work begins in

earnest.

This year's Enchantica display at Minton House was developed by Sarah Astley, retail and exhibition designer, who has worked for the Company for more than 16 years. Sarah designs and draws up plans for shows, exhibitions and shops. For this year's display she wanted to create an extravagant display for Enchantica and so with Pat Booth she developed some

exciting colourful concepts.

John Smith and Richard Wood, the company's in-house joiners built the foundation for the display from wood, leaving Sarah to construct the surface from plaster. Sarah wanted to create a cavern and as the plaster was fast setting it had to be built up bit by bit so it was a long painstaking process. When dry there was more time to decorate the structure and Sarah used different coloured car sprays to achieve the look she was aiming for.

Sarah admires the inspiration that comes from the designers and modellers of Enchantica dragons and she appreciates all the shapes, details and colours. She loved the chance to design an imaginative display for Enchantica and was delighted with the outcome.

The exhibition at the N.E.C. was more formal in concept and was designed by another member of the team, Neilson Jones, again with input from Pat Booth.

Neil has been at Royal Doulton for six years but prior to joining the Company had worked as a visual merchandiser in a retail environment for more than 20 years.


Planning is an essential part of all exhibition design as there is an immovable deadline but it is even more important when working off site and Neil has to ensure that all safety issues, transport, delivery of products and other needs such as electrical supply are considered and organised.

Once the concept and product layouts for the stand have been agreed the units are built or existing units re-painted. At the appropriate time these will be transported to the N.E.C for Neil to display using Enchantica and other Holland Studio Craft products. Graphics are often an important part of exhibitions and these needs are discussed and then carried out by the in-house graphic designer, David Lovatt.

This year the stand had a very clean welcoming image, which encouraged retailers to visit.

Following the end of the show Neil has to return to supervise the dismantling of the stand and the return of stock, units and props.

Many retailers visited the exhibitions, whether at Minton House or at the NEC and complimented our visual merchandising team on the success, professionalism and creativity of their work. from Snarlgard, Arangast and Gorgoyle.


